

Regional Progress Toward the Millennium Development Goals

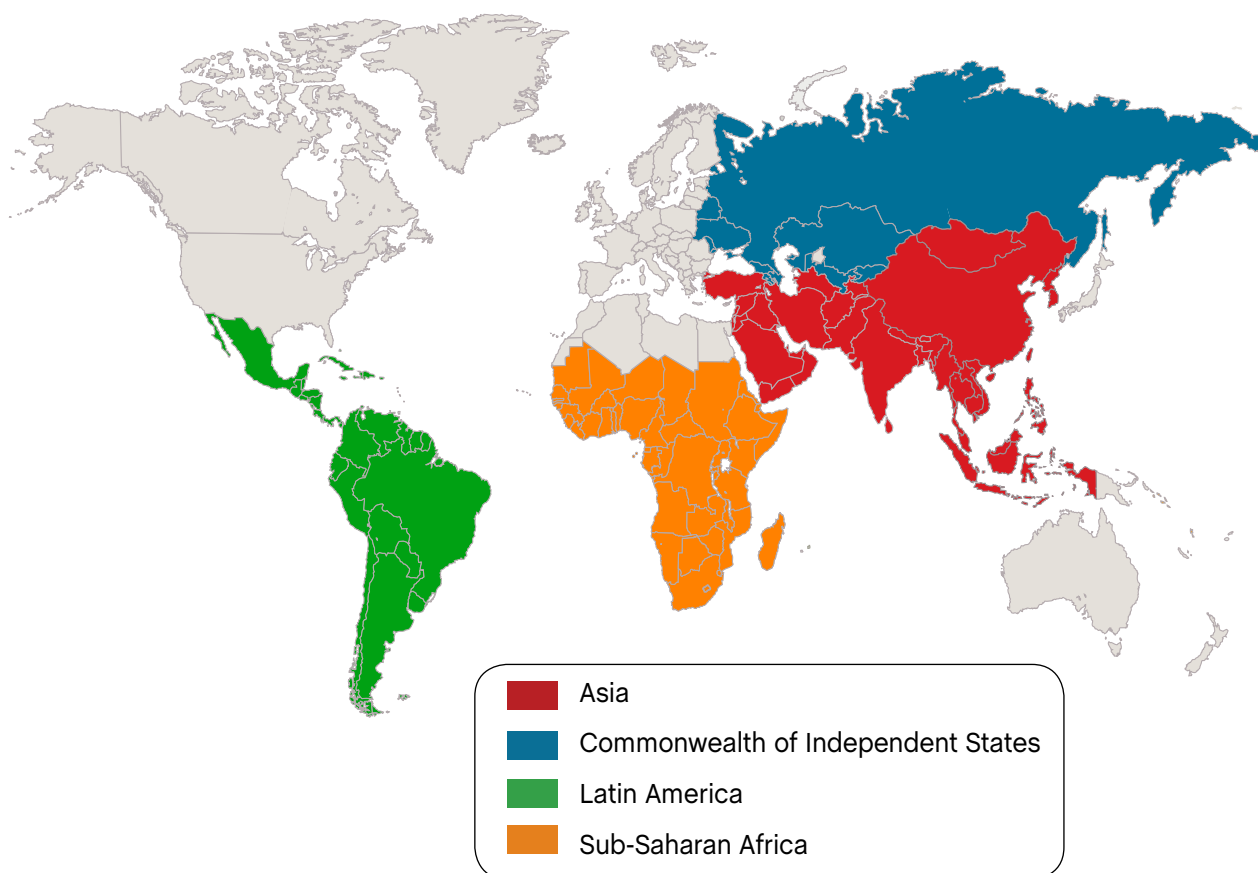
In 2000, at a special session of the United Nations, the member nations committed to “making the right to development a reality for everyone and to freeing the entire human race from want.” From this commitment emerged a set of eight interrelated goals that have come to be known as the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

The MDGs represent unprecedented support for the world’s hungry and poor people and provide a framework for coordinating development efforts. By including measurable targets, the MDGs allow us to assess progress and determine what adjustments are needed in national and international strategies to achieve the goals. Most importantly, by situating the MDGs within the context of the right to development and combining goals across different areas—hunger, poverty, education,

health, gender equality, environmental sustainability and trade—the MDGs demonstrate an interconnected vision of development and human rights.

The MDG Annex provides a snapshot of regional progress toward achieving the goals, highlighting areas where progress is occurring and where regions are falling behind. The regions included are Asia, Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), Latin America, and Sub-Saharan Africa. The Annex also includes country-level data.

Progress has been occurring too slowly to achieve all of the MDGs in every country by the 2015 target date. Just past the halfway point, it is time to take stock of global progress and seek new paths forward. Now is the time to recapture the spirit of 2000 and make real the promise of a better world for all.

A Snapshot of Regional Progress: Asia

Asia is a large and diverse region and progress toward the MDGs is mixed. Because of the large populations in India and China, trends in these countries drives much of the regional progress as a whole. Economic growth helped to significantly reduce extreme poverty in the Eastern and South-eastern Asia sub-regions. Substantial improvements have also occurred in improving access to sanitation facilities and in increasing primary school enrollment, particularly among girls.

Less progress has occurred in reducing hunger, and any further progress is threatened by the rise in food prices that took place over the course of 2008. Four of the five countries responsible for more than 50 percent of all stunted children are in Asia (India, China, Bangladesh and Pakistan). As in other parts of the world, the Asia region has made little progress in maternal mortality.

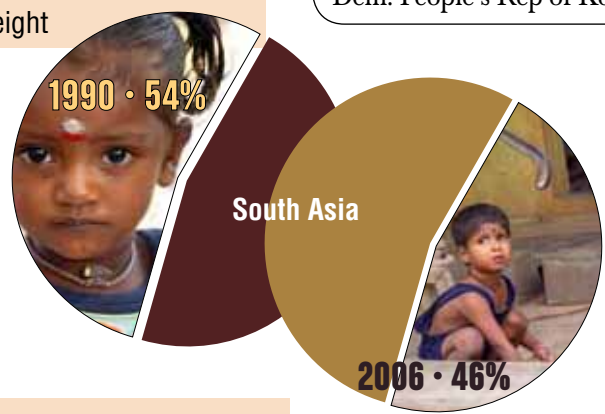

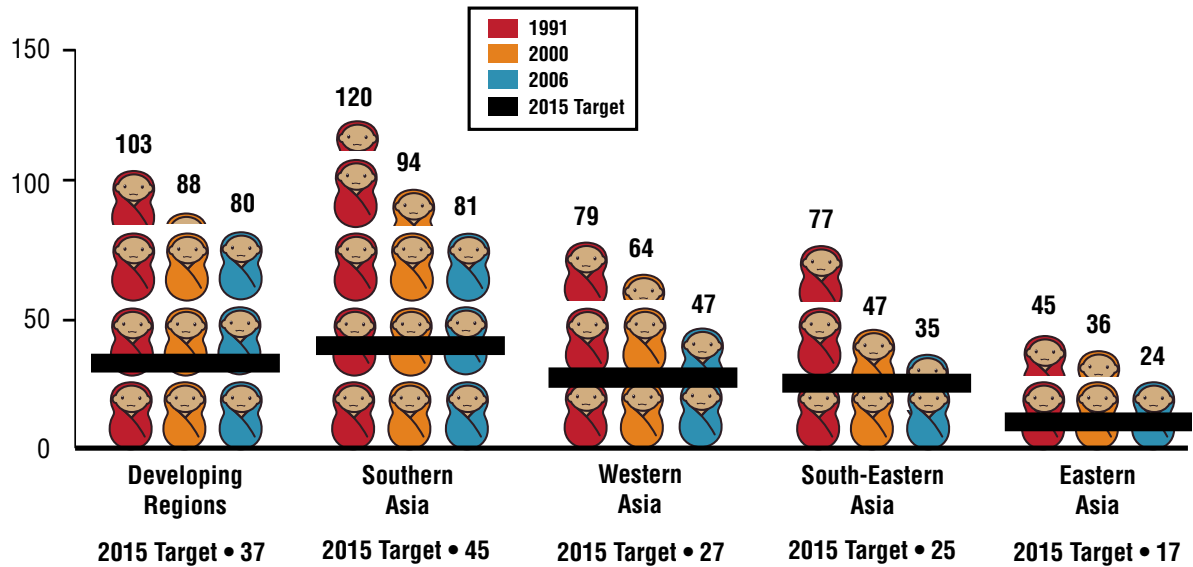

Achieving Goal 5 to improve maternal health will require Asian countries to reduce maternal mortality rates from 330 deaths per 100,000 live births today to 98 per 100,000 by 2015.



A Snapshot of Regional Progress: CIS

The breakup of the Soviet Union negatively affected many areas of social and economic development in CIS. Extreme poverty increased substantially in the region, and hunger in the general population has remained virtually unchanged—although progress has occurred against child hunger. The number of new cases of tuberculosis increased between 1990 and 2000, and has not fallen. As a whole, CIS countries are not expected to meet Goal 6 to halt and reverse the spread of infectious diseases.

Not all trends are negative, however. Child and maternal mortality rates have had promising drops and many CIS countries will achieve MDGs 4 and 5, reducing child mortality by two-thirds and maternal mortality by three-quarters. Most CIS countries will achieve the target for primary school enrolment and reach parity in primary school enrollment for boys and girls.

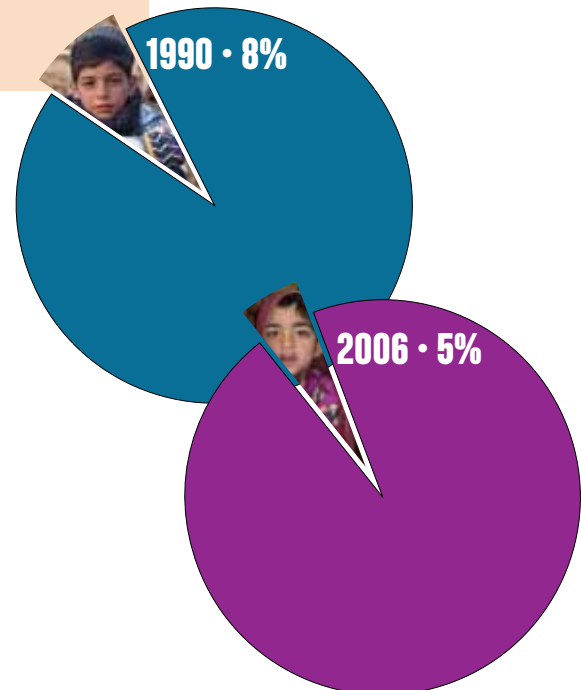

Percent of the Population Living Below \$1.25 a Day

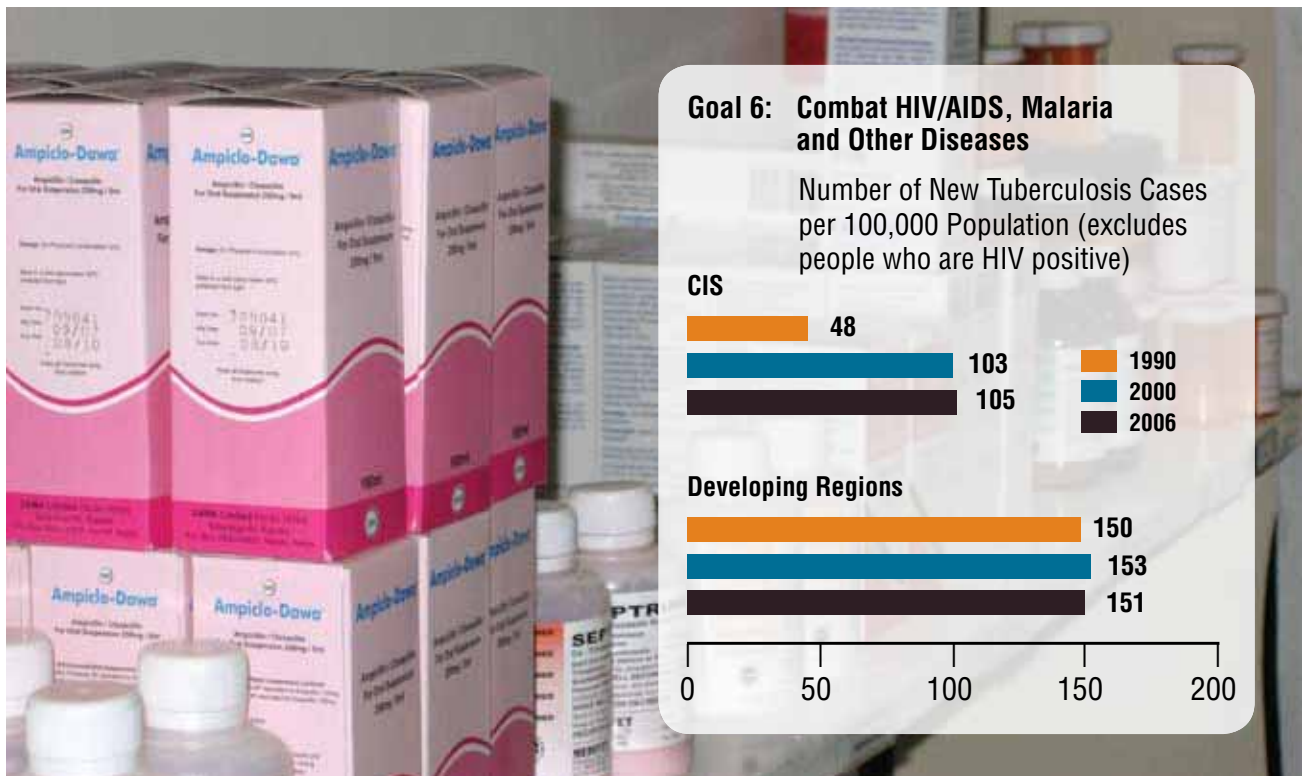
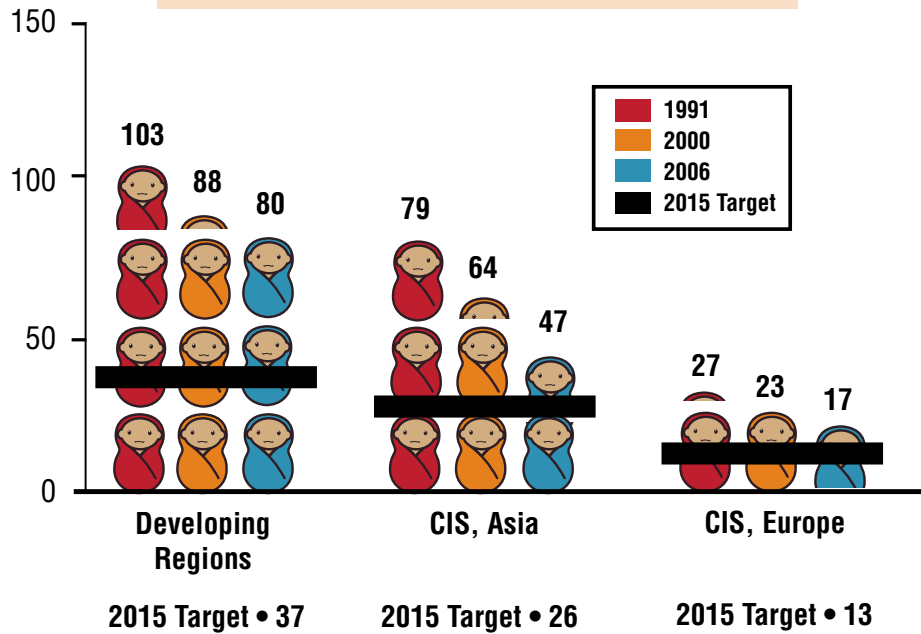

A Snapshot of Regional Progress: Latin America

Laudable progress has been made in Latin America and the Caribbean. While the region is not on track to meet the target of reducing extreme poverty, it is on track to meet the hunger goal. Latin America and Caribbean countries are achieving some progress in the area of gender equality. Since 1990, women have significantly increased their role in the non-farm economy, and there is near gender parity of enrollment in primary school. Increasing access to safe drinking water is another bright spot; many Latin American and Caribbean countries have already achieved this goal. One area that requires much greater work is fighting infectious disease. After sub-Saharan Africa, the Caribbean countries have the highest prevalence of HIV/AIDs.

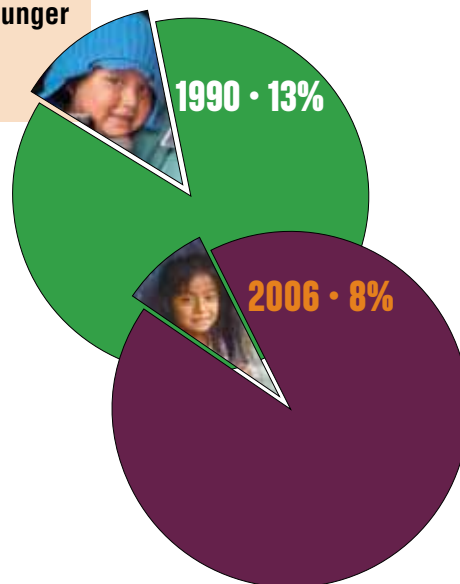

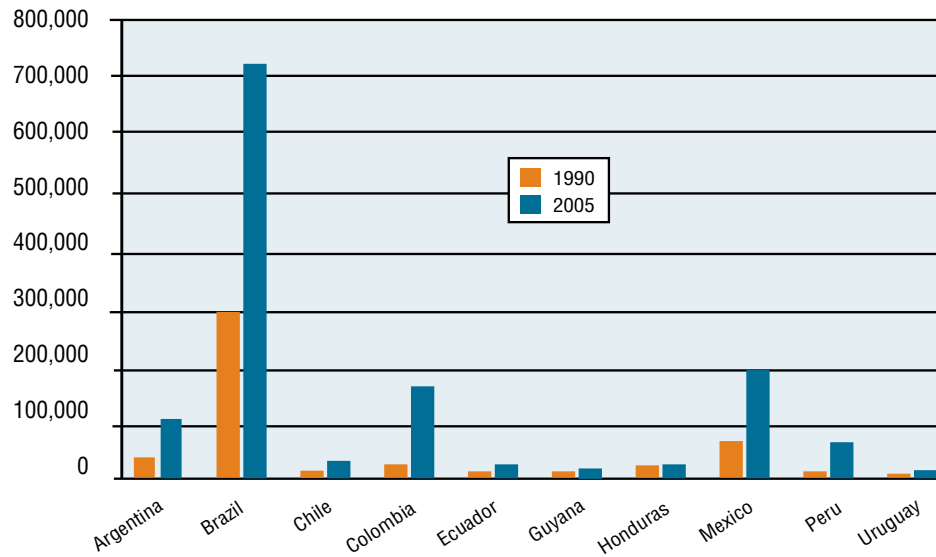

A Snapshot of Regional Progress: Sub-Saharan Africa

Sub-Saharan African countries face some of the greatest challenges to achieving the MDGs. Extreme poverty and hunger remain large problems. Next to Asia, sub-Saharan Africa suffered the greatest increase in hunger from the rapid rise in food prices. An estimated 24 million more people were pushed into hunger in 2007. For many of the other MDGs, the trends are positive but the rate of progress is too slow to meet the 2015 target date. Primary school enrollment has increased but the region lags behind all others. Only about half of the region's population has access to clean drinking water, a problem that undoubtedly contributed to the high child mortality rate. Gender disparities persist in the region, with only about a third of women are employed in non-agricultural sector.

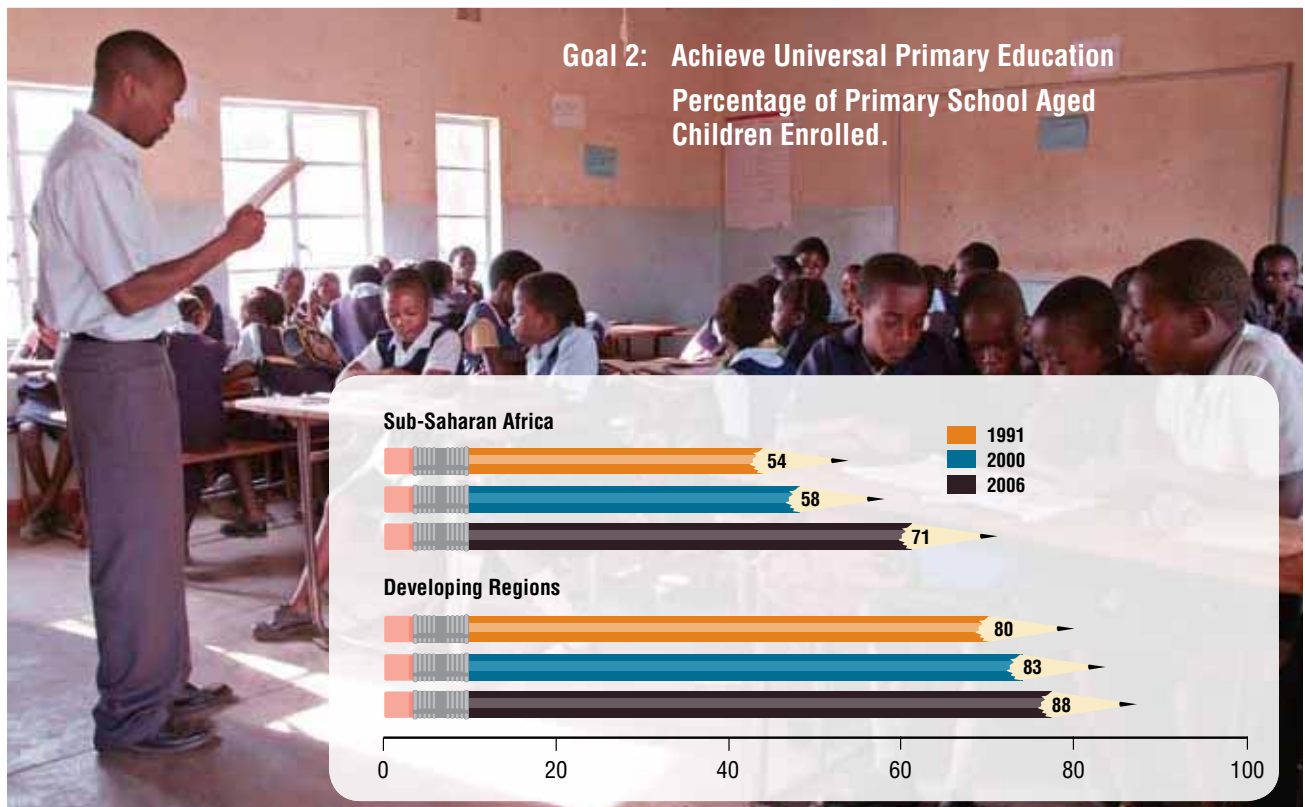
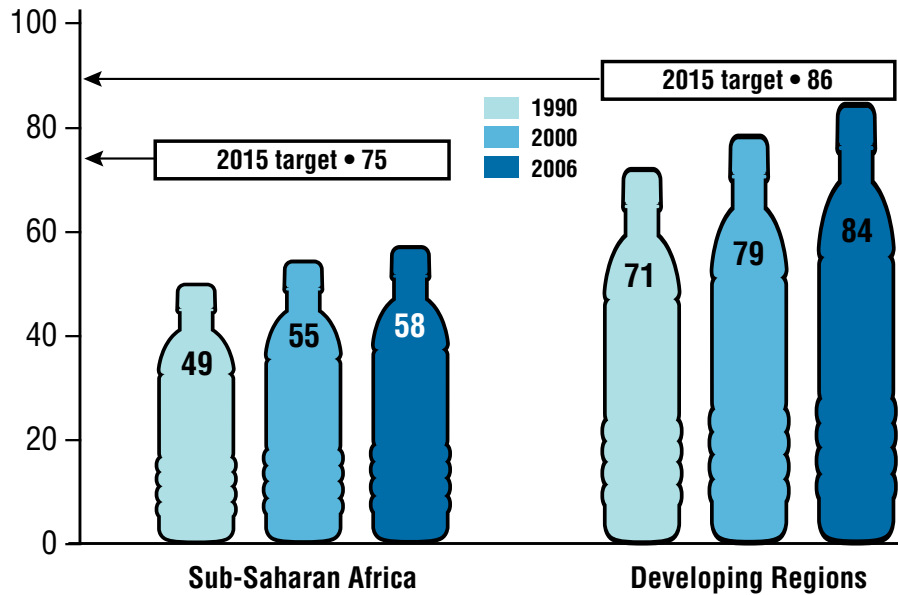
